We are happy to report Randy and Marcia's 200 has been completely disassembled, checked and replacements made when necessary. The rear axle ratio had been changed from salsbury 4:30 to 1, to 3:54 to 1 with new shocks and springs. Randy replaced one frame tube on nose that was dented. He took it off a wrecked T.V.R. and also instarlled the front stabilizer bar which was missing. He has had lots of glass work done to bring the "Original Griffith" back from it's modified appearance. Randy painted everything before reassembling - looks real nice. Now it is ready for paint and upholstery.

In John Iloff's garage we find John putting in a new hi-performance clutch and pressure plate, new shifter, new bellhousing and throwout bearing. John has super sanitized the complete engine compartment while he had engine out and replaced a lot of pieces with chrome ones. (You don't have to take engine out to replace clutch.) Recently, John installed a 271 hi-performance Cam and Kit, screwed in studs, cobra intake and duel feed holly and hi-performance duel point distributor . . it makes a hell of a difference. John also had the wheel hubs machined to a Ford bolt pattern and installed Crager Wheels. That little silver 200 looks good John.
