Trevor Wilkinson Trophy:

10 RO's Forum Questions/Discussion

- Mervyn introduced the updated RO Handbook available for collection and that a pdf version would be emailed to all RO/DROs.
- Richard introduced Fred Heddell & Brian Cooper who have volunteered as ROCo.

Q. Could the Club buy a PA system for use at outdoor events?

- A. While we don't currently have one, we will investigate the costs etc.
- Q. Could the Club have a system of outdoor display cards for each model?
- A. Ralph explained that he uses new laminated ones each year for the NEC and thinks this is the best system. Another RO felt that the social interaction at event s was far more important and not having display cards encouraged it.
- Q. Could we have dedicated RO email addresses rather forwarding to personal ones?

- A. Under the present system the new member is given the RO's details, but we don't always have the new member's permission to disclose their contact details. We will review the system. ROs can always request a list for their region based on Royal Mail "Out-Codes" ie. the first part of a PostCode.
- Q. Can we increase the size limit for pictures on our forum?
- A. Paul Calland will review what is possible, but is a balance of size vs speed.
