3	Minutes of 2023 AGM ~ Approval & Matters Arising: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Approval of the previous meeting's minutes was proposed and agreed.• There were no matters arising or outstanding.	ML
4	Chairman's Report: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Richard explained that he was standing down at this AGM after 20 years as a Committee member including 7 years as Chairman. It had been an honour to be Chairman and had met many new friends.• He'd seen significant recent changes. Since the Covid 19 "lock down" the Committee has changed from bi-monthly meetings here at Gaydon to monthly using zoom. Saving significant expense.• Zoom has also enabled us to have sub-group meetings to work on particular topics and events. Eg. NEC Show, member recruitment.• We have increased our social media presence Eg. TVR Torque on Facebook.• We've introduced our monthly eNewsletter to highlight forthcoming events and any latest news. It goes to every member for whom we have an email address.• Finally, He made the point that our Club was not run by him, not just the Committee or by the Office. The Club is actually run by the ROs, DROs and many other volunteers, they are the Club and without them there wouldn't be a Club.	

5 Treasurer's Report:

- Paul presented his report which included a plan to introduce digital membership cards which would save several £'000s per annum. A show of hands indicated widespread support for the suggestion.

6 Presentation of Awards

Trevor Wilkinson Trophy:

Mervyn explained Trevor's Trophy was for the best restoration completed in 2023~24 There were 3 outstanding entries, a rare 420SEAC, a V8S and a Griffith 500. The voting was close, but the award this year belongs to Glen Wilson for his 1986 420SEAC.

All 3 entries will be featured in Sprint.

Folkard Cup:

Colin explained this award was for the RO that has made the greatest contribution during the year. ROs and their Deputies are the backbone of our Club and work incredibly hard for their local members. There were several nominations, but the 2024 winner is Heath Briggs, (Blackpool).

Scott-Moncrieff Trophy:

The TVR racing award goes to recently deceased Hugh Chamberlain who took TVR to Le Mans in 2004.

Mleczek Award:

A new annual award in memory of former TVR employee and Blackpool RO, John Mleczek. Awarded for "Spirit of TVR" to Tony Hodgeson.

8 Questions previously submitted to the Secretary

- Q. An RO asked:** Why is there no recognition for members who reach say 10, 20 or 30 years of membership. A simple badge on different colours would be one idea. This must be a simple thing to do as you know when members joined?
- R.** Mervyn explained that there were 2 issues, one technical, one financial. When the membership was computerised in 1995-96 no record was made of the Date of Joining either for existing or new members. We therefore directly don't have the information. It was suggested that ROs could issue a certificate to any qualifying local member they were aware of, at least 1 RO had already done this.
- Q. A member asked:** What has been the cost for the NEC shows for 2021, 2022 and 2023?
- R.** Paul replied that the figures were in his earlier report.
- Q. A member asked:** What happens to the surplus money raised from Track Day events?
- A.** Paul replied that any additional income, including track days, helps to keep membership fees down and manage the risk of future events.
- Q. A member asked:** What plans the Committee had for succession strategy for retiring members when they stood down?
- A.** Mervyn replied that we had a current vacancy, also that he will stand down as Club Secretary at the next AGM a role required under the Companies Act and a Motorsport UK registered club.
Like many clubs, we rely on volunteers responding to advertisements and personal contacts.

TREASURER'S REPORT AGM 2024



Year ending 30 September 2023

The outturn this time is in line with the approved budget, and I am pleased that results were within a couple of thousands of that predicted in the year



RESULTS

- At the AGM last September, I informed what I thought the outturn for this year would be & it was pretty much as forecast

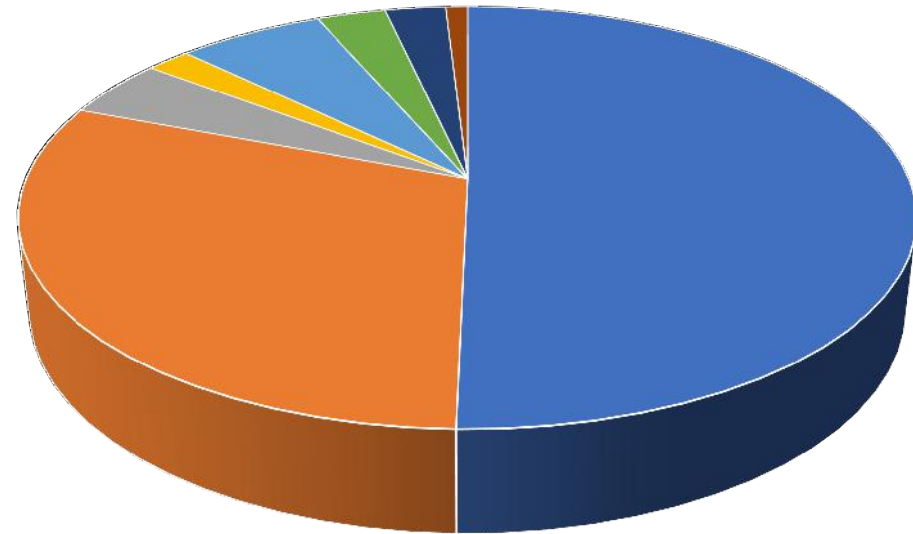

- The last AGM voted to change the Articles of Association to remove the need for an audit in favour of an Accountants' assurance & this created the saving in expenditure.



Your Fees

- With membership still declining, the last AGM voted to increase members' fees & this was enacted for this financial year from 01 November 2023
- Membership income estimated to raise £234,000

- Total costs of running the Club, excluding events & Merchandise is £284,000
- Membership income estimated to raise £234,000
- Deficit of £ 50,000
 - Advertising & Sponsorship £43,000
 - Investment Income £5,000
 - Insurance Commission £2,000
- Basic membership cost if no additional income generated, including from Merchandise Sales & some events – would be around £85



Conclusions & Plans

- Our income has improved marginally to meet inflationary costs
 - Membership numbers are estimated to be down 2% this year
 - Costs are under control despite the cost-of-living increase that commenced in 2022
 - There is a lack of volunteers in certain critical areas that causes us to engage consultants
 - A further small membership fee is required from May 2024

- Continuing to make membership renewal by Direct Debit more financially attractive
 - Continuing to focus on new & retention of members
 - Increasing Events and ensuring events are not a drain on resources
 - Continuing to closely monitor all our costs
 - Continuing to seek volunteers for critical roles

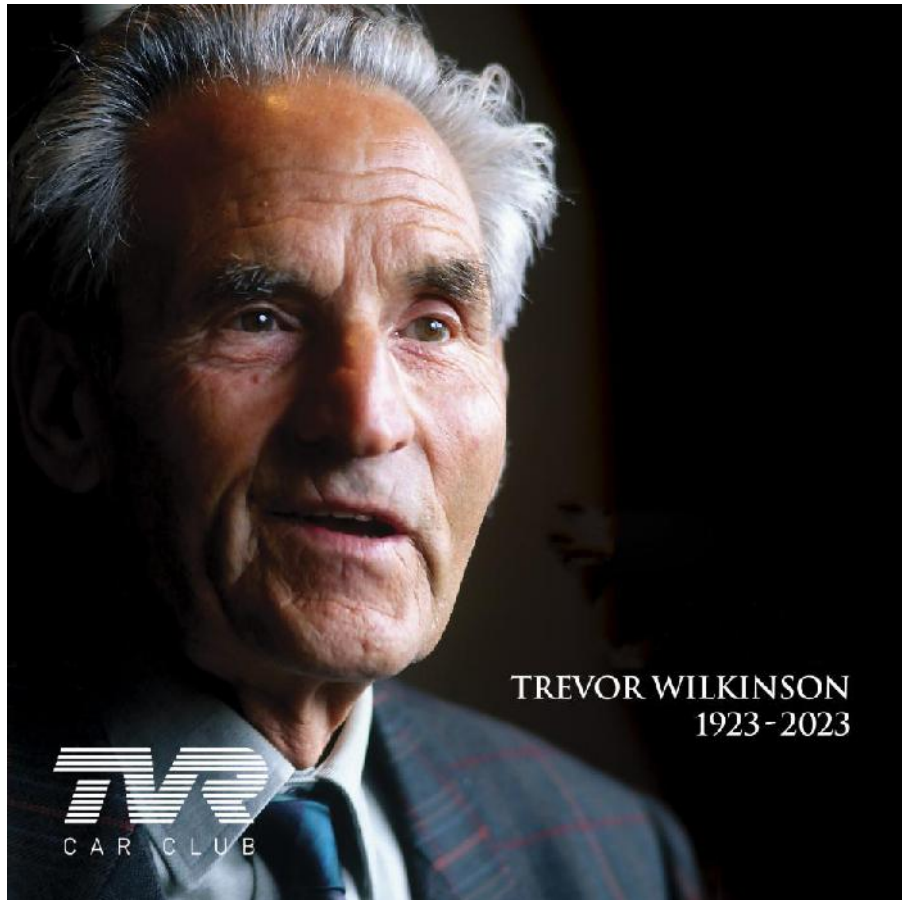

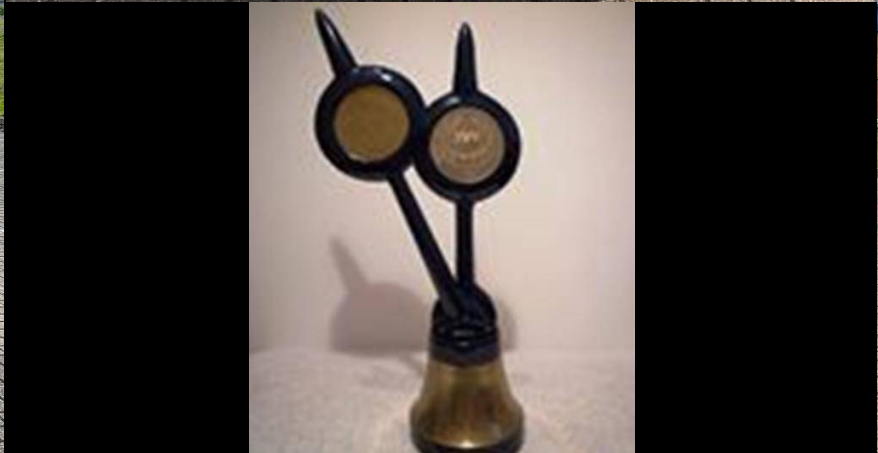

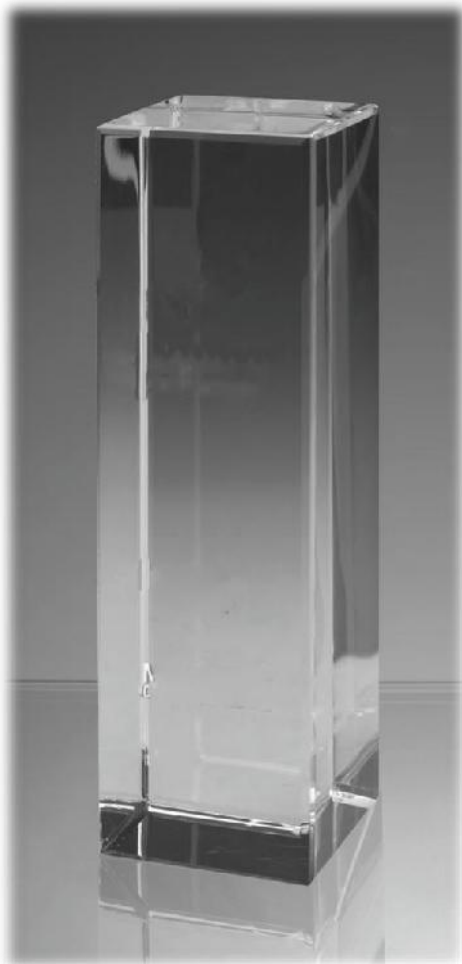
